## Annunciation of the Theotokos- March 25



Six months after John the Forerunner's conception, the Archangel Gabriel was sent by God to Nazareth, a town of Galilee, unto Mary the Virgin, who had come forth from the Temple a mature maiden (see Nov. 21). According to the tradition handed down by the Fathers, she had been betrothed to Joseph four months. On coming to Joseph's house, the Archangel declared: "Rejoice, thou Full of Grace, the Lord is with thee: blessed art thou among women." After some consideration, and turmoil of soul, and fear because of this greeting, the Virgin, when she had finally obtained full assurance concerning God's unsearchable condescension and the ineffable dispensation that was to take place through her, and believing that all things are possible to the Most High, answered in humility: "Behold the handmaid of the Lord; be it unto me according to thy word." And at this, the Holy Spirit came upon her, and the power of the Most High overshadowed her all-blameless womb, and the Son and Word of God, Who existed before the ages, was conceived past speech and understanding, and became flesh in her immaculate body (Luke 1:26-38). Bearing in her womb the Uncontainable One, the blessed Virgin went with haste from Nazareth to the hill country of Judea, where Zacharias had his dwelling; for she desired to find Elizabeth her kinswoman and rejoice together with her, because, as she had learned from the Archangel, Elizabeth had conceived in her old age. Furthermore, she wished to tell her of the great things that the Mighty One had been well-pleased to bring to pass in her, and she greeted Elizabeth and drew nigh to her. When Elizabeth heard Mary's greeting, she felt her six-month-old babe, Saint John the Baptist, prophesied of the dawning of the spiritual Sun. Immediately, the aged Elizabeth was filled with the Holy Spirit and recognized her as the Mother of her Lord, and with a great voice blessed her and the Fruit that she held within herself. The Virgin also, moved by a supernatural rejoicing in the spirit, glorified her God and Savior, saying: "My soul doth magnify the Lord, and my spirit hath rejoiced in God my Saviour," and the rest, as the divine Luke hath recorded (1:39-55)




# **YOUTH BOOK**: A Child's Guide to Prayer by Ancient Faith Pulishing, illustrated by Tara Pappas

A Child's Guide to Prayer is a beautifully illustrated prayer book for Orthodox Christian children aged 5-10 who are just developing a habit of prayer. The selection includes morning and evening prayers, prayers during the day, at mealtimes, for family and friends, and prayers of and to the saints - along with psalms to pray and prayers that have to do with communion and confession. All the prayers were carefully selected by priests and youth workers to ensure their age-appropriateness. The 120-page guide also includes brief instructions on how to pray, why we pray, and a list of different ways to pray. The book concludes with several blank pages for personal prayer requests.



#### ADULT BOOK: A Basic Guide to Eastern Orthodox Theology: Introducing Beliefs and Practices by Eve Tibbs (Author)

Eve Tibbs offers a comprehensive yet accessible introduction to the beliefs and practices of the Eastern Orthodox Church for Western readers. Tibbs has devoted her career to translating the Orthodox faith to an evangelical audience and has over twenty years of experience teaching this material to students. Assuming no prior knowledge of Orthodox theology, this survey covers the basic ideas of Eastern Orthodox Christianity from its origins at Pentecost to the present day.



#### **DONATION REQUEST**

Donation of small water bottles and small juice boxes are needed for coffee hour. If you would like to donate either of these items please drop them off at St. George or bring them on a Sunday. Thank you.

Just a friendly reminder that when you are receiving holy communion and / or kissing an icon, please not wear any type of lip product. Thank you. Church, for us Orthodox Christians, is the holiest of all places. It is the place where we come face-to-face with our Lord, thereby, demanding the utmost in respect and conduct. While in Church, WE DO NOT chew gum, candy, etc., and WE DO NOT cross our legs or move around and carry on a conversation, especially in the Narthex of our Church.

All of these activities tend to distract those around us and lead our soul away from the mystical experiences of the Divine Liturgy. Our movements about the Church, at their appointed times, should be done with the utmost respect for the place in which the Lord dwells.

#### WHEN ARE WE NOT TO ENTER THE NAVE of our CHURCH?

As we are entering God's Home, we must always keep in mind that during the following times, WE MUST NOT ENTER THE NAVE of our Church NOR COME TO THE FRONT of the Church to light a votive candle:

- During the Small Entrance (when the procession with the Gospel takes place)
- During the EPISTLE Reading
- During the GOSPEL Reading
- When the priest is censing and is facing the Congregation
- During the GREAT ENTRANCE (when the procession of the Holy Gifts takes place)
- When the priest is blessing the Congregation
- During the recitation of the Nicene Creed ("I believe...")
- During the Consecration of the Holy Gifts
- During the recitation of the Lord's Prayer ("Our Father...") During the Priest's sermon

#### WHEN DO WE KNEEL?

- We do not kneel on Sundays during the consecration of the Holy Gifts as Sundays are resurrectional in nature
- We do kneel on Weekday services except from Easter until the Pentecost

   However, for many decades in our Churches, the Faithful have had the pious tradition of kneeling, even if it has been technically and theologically wrong to do so
- After receiving Holy Communion, we step away from the Chalice before doing our Cross
- We fast year-round on Wednesdays and Fridays; Saturdays are not fasting days

#### WHILE IN CHURCH, REMEMBER to ...

- Wear appropriate attire to enter God's House
- Silence your mobile devices
- Sit with your legs uncrossed
- Refrain from chewing gum, mints, or candy
- Remove lipstick when receiving Holy Communion or when venerating and kissing the icons
- Follow the direction of the Priest for standing & sitting
- Maintain quiet in the Sanctuary
- Refrain from greeting others while in the Church during and exiting from the Divine Liturgy -
- that is reserved for Fellowship Hour AFTER services
- Refrain from applauding
- Not to occupy the hallways or community center during the Divine Liturgy. Instead...
- Enter God's House formally with reverence and respect





Please remember, if you have already obtained a civil divorce, you must also receive an Ecclesiastical Divorce from the Church

This brief process is confidentially handled by the parish priest. You must complete this process in order to be in good standing with the Church, meaning that you may not partake in the Sacramental life of the Church, (example: being a sponsor at a wedding or baptism, receiving the Sacrament of Holy Communion and Holy Unction, serving on the Parish Council, voting at Parish Assemblies and entering into another

marriage).

Please consider your personal situation and be in good standing with the Church. If you have questions or concerns, please contact Fr. Zissis directly.

If you desire a pastoral visit in case of a hospitalization, or for someone who is homebound, in a nursing facility, or in prison, please have an immediate family member notify the Church office 610.459.0366 or if it is an emergency you can contact Fr. *If you need prayers for Health, Healing or any other Concerns* please contact Father Zissis for spititual advise and to arrange the appropriate services or sacraments, according to our Holy Orthodox Church.
