Constantine and Helen, Equal-to-the Apostles— May 21

This great and renowned sovereign of the Christians was the son of Constantius Chlorus (the ruler of the westernmost parts of the Roman empire), and of the blessed Helen. He was born in 272, in (according to some authorities) Naissus of Dardania, a city on the Hellespont. In 306, when his father died, he was proclaimed successor to his throne. In 312, on learning that Maxentius and Maximinus had joined forces against him, he marched into Italy,

where, while at the head of his troops, he saw a pillar in the form of a cross with the words: "By the Name of Jesus Christ. On the 28th Of October, he and was proclaimed Emperor of the West by the the East. But out of malice, Licinius later persecuted again, and utterly destroyed him in 324, and the East. Constantine fought him once in this manner he became monarch over the West and persecutions against the Church ceased. Christianity he gathered the First Ecumenical Council in Nicaea, in the ancient city of Byzantium, he laid the founda-

tions of the new capital of his realm, and solemnly inaugurated it on May 11, 330, naming it after himself, Constantinople. Since the throne of the imperial rule was transferred thither from Rome, it was named New Rome, the inhabitants of its domain were called Romans, and it was considered the continuation of the Roman Empire. Falling ill near Nicomedia, he requested to receive divine Baptism, according to Eusebius (The Life of Constantine. Book IV, 61-62), and also according to Socrates and Sozomen; and when he had been deemed worthy of the Holy Mysteries, he reposed in 337, on May 21 or 22, the day of Pentecost, having lived sixty-five years, of which he ruled for thirty-one years. His remains were transferred to Constantinople and were deposited in the Church of the Holy Apostles, which had been built by him (see Homily XXVI on Second Corinthians by Saint John Chrysostom).

As for his holy mother Helen, after her son had made the Faith of Christ triumphant throughout the Roman Empire, she undertook a journey to Jerusalem and found the Holy Cross on which our Lord was crucified (see Sept. 13 and 14). After this, Saint Helen, in her zeal to glorify Christ, erected churches in Jerusalem at the sites of the Crucifixion and Resurrection, in Bethlehem at the cave where our Saviour was born, another on the Mount of Olives whence He ascended into Heaven, and many others throughout the Holy Land, Cyprus, and elsewhere. She was proclaimed Augusta, her image was stamped upon golden coins, and two cities were named Helenopolis after her in Bithynia and in Palestine. Having been thus glorified for her piety, she departed to the Lord being about eighty years of age, according to some in the year 330, according to others, in 336.

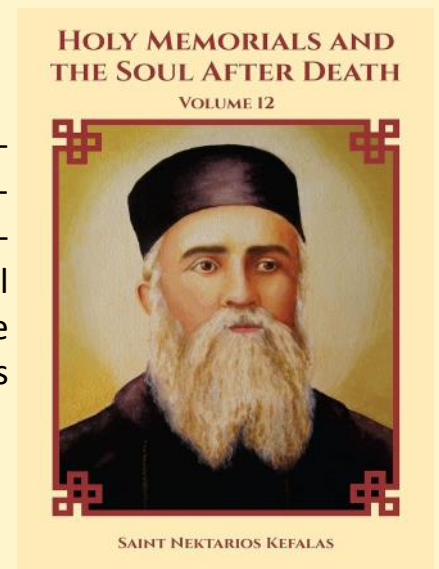

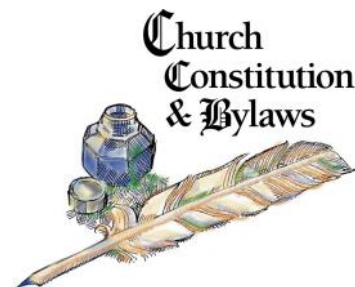
Church, for us Orthodox Christians, is the holiest of all places. It is the place where we come face-to-face with our Lord, thereby, demanding the utmost in respect and conduct. While in Church, WE DO NOT chew gum, candy, etc., and WE DO NOT cross our legs or move around and carry on a conversation, especially in the Narthex of our Church.

All of these activities tend to distract those around us and lead our soul away from the mystical experiences of the Divine Liturgy. Our movements about the Church, at their appointed times, should be done with the utmost respect for the place in which the Lord dwells.

WHEN ARE WE NOT TO ENTER THE NAVE of our CHURCH?

As we are entering God's Home, we must always keep in mind that during the following times, WE MUST NOT ENTER THE NAVE of our Church NOR COME TO THE FRONT of the Church to light a votive candle:

- *During the Small Entrance (when the procession with the Gospel takes place)*
- *During the EPISTLE Reading*
- *During the GOSPEL Reading*
- *When the priest is censuring and is facing the Congregation*
- *During the GREAT ENTRANCE (when the procession of the Holy Gifts takes place)*
- *When the priest is blessing the Congregation*
- *During the recitation of the Nicene Creed ("I believe...")*
- *During the Consecration of the Holy Gifts*
- *During the recitation of the Lord's Prayer ("Our Father...")*
- *During the Priest's sermon*

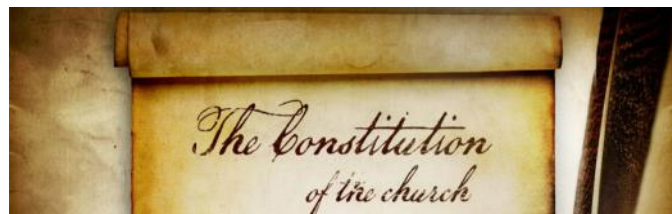


WHEN DO WE KNEEL ?

- **We do not kneel** on Sundays during the consecration of the Holy Gifts as Sundays are resurrectional in nature
- **We do kneel** on Weekday services except from Easter until the Pentecost
– However, for many decades in our Churches, the Faithful have had the pious tradition of kneeling, even if it has been technically and theologically wrong to do so
- After receiving Holy Communion, **we step away from the Chalice before doing our Cross**
- **We fast year-round on Wednesdays and Fridays**; Saturdays are not fasting days

WHILE IN CHURCH, REMEMBER to...

- *Wear appropriate attire to enter God's House*
- *Silence your mobile devices*
- *Sit with your legs uncrossed*
- *Refrain from chewing gum, mints, or candy*
- *Remove lipstick when receiving Holy Communion or when venerating and kissing the icons*
- *Follow the direction of the Priest for standing & sitting*
- *Maintain quiet in the Sanctuary*
- *Refrain from greeting others while in the Church during and exiting from the Divine Liturgy - that is reserved for Fellowship Hour AFTER services*
- *Refrain from applauding*
- *Not to occupy the hallways or community center during the Divine Liturgy. Instead...*
- *Enter God's House formally with reverence and respect*



Please remember, if you have already obtained a civil divorce, you must also receive an Ecclesiastical Divorce from the Church

This brief process is confidentially handled by the parish priest. You must complete this process in order to be in good standing with the Church, meaning that you may not partake in the Sacramental life of the Church, (example: being a sponsor at a wedding or baptism, receiving the Sacrament of Holy Communion and Holy Unction, serving on the Parish Council, voting at Parish Assemblies and entering into another marriage).

Please consider your personal situation and be in good standing with the Church. If you have questions or concerns, please contact Fr. Zissis directly.

Pastoral Visits - A Request to All Parishioners:

If you desire a pastoral visit in case of a hospitalization, or for someone who is homebound, in a nursing facility, or in prison, please have an immediate family member notify the Church office 610.459.0366 or if it is an emergency you can contact Fr. Zissis at 617.990.4390 so that a visit can be arranged.

If you need prayers for Health, Healing or any other Concerns please contact Father Zissis for spiritual advise and to arrange the appropriate services or sacraments, according to our Holy Orthodox Church.

For all **Memorial services and Artoclasia**, we kindly ask that you also supply **wine and oil for the Altar**.

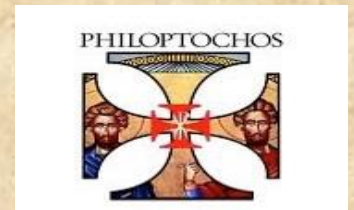
